1. Prayer in the present petition filed under 528 of BNSS, 2023 seeking directions to official respondent Nos.1 to 3 to not to harass the petitioner on account of complaints filed by respondent No.5 and to comply with the provisions of Section 160 Cr.P.C. and further prayer is to look into representation dated 28.03.2025 (Annexure P-4) moved to respondent No.2.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that due to some land dispute, the private respondents in connivance with the police are harassing the petitioner by filing false and frivolous complaints. He further submits that the petitioner has filed a civil suit qua the land in dispute and interim injunction has also been granted in his favour, however, the private respondents, with the help of police are interfering in the construction on the land in dispute. In this regard, the petitioner has also filed a contempt petition before learned Civil Court, Jalandhar on 29.03.2025. He further submits that respondent No.5 has also filed a petition before District Development and Panchayat Officer-Cum-Collector, Jalandhar against the petitioner, in order to



harass him, whereby, vide order dated 01.04.2025, the parties were directed to maintain status quo. The petitioner has submitted a representation dated 28.03.2025 to respondent No.2, but no action was taken.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner would be satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-4) submitted by the petitioner, in a time bound manner.

4. Notice of motion to official respondents only.

5. Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply a copy of complete paper book to learned State counsel today itself.

6. Keeping in view the prayer made by the petitioners and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-4) submitted by the petitioner and take appropriate steps in view of the submissions made therein, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.
