1. Present criminal writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents No.2 & 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners from the hands of respondents No.4 to 10 and further to take appropriate legal action on the representations dated 12.03.2025 and 18.03.2025 (Annexures P-3 & P-4) submitted by petitioner No.1.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners, *inter alia*, contends that the petitioners are daughters of respondent No.5 and they were married in the same



in-laws family and respondents No.6 & 7 are their elder uncle and brother, respectively. Vide transfer deed dated 27.12.2023 (Annexure P-1), respondent No.5 transferred a house measuring 10.5 marlas in the name of petitioner No.1, as such, she is in actual and physical possession of the same. Further, when respondent No.5 was disregarded by his family, petitioner No.1 took care of him and she also repaid outstanding loan amount of Rs.8.32 lakhs. Respondents No.5 to 8, in connivance with each other, sold the house in question to respondents No.9 & 10 and they tried to forcibly oust petitioner No.1 from the said house, however, they failed to do so. Thereafter, petitioner No.1 filed a civil suit before learned Civil Court at Phul, in which, on 06.03.2025, status quo was ordered to be maintained by the parties, as discernible from Annexure P-2. Furthermore, petitioner No.1 submitted representations dated 12.03.2025 & 18.03.2025 (Annexures P-3 & P-4) before respondents No.2 & 4, respectively for taking legal action against respondents No.5 to 10, but till date, no action has been taken thereon.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners further contends that while thwarting the attempt of private respondents to oust petitioner No.1 from the house in question, petitioner No.2 suffered serious injuries. The private respondents also tried to set petitioner No.1 on fire by pouring petrol on her body and while leaving the place of occurrence, the private respondents threatened the petitioners to eliminate them. Thereafter, petitioner No.2 was



got admitted in Civil Hospital for treatment and MLR dated 08.04.2025 of petitioner No.2 is available on record as Annexure P-5. Further, respondent No.4-ASI Amrik Singh, at the behest of private respondents, who are influential persons, threatened the petitioners to vacate the house in question and to hand over its possession to respondents No.9 & 10, otherwise he would implicate them in a false case. When no action has been taken on the representations (Annexures P-3 & P-4) submitted by petitioner No.1 to the jurisdictional police authorities, they approached this Court seeking protection to their lives and liberty from the hands of respondents No.4 to 10.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that the petitioners would be satisfied, in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation dated 18.03.2025 (Annexure P-4) submitted by petitioner No.1 in a time bound manner.

5. Notice of motion to the official respondents only.

6. On asking of the Court, Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3-State. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply copy of complete paperbook to learned State counsel during course of the day.

7. Keeping in view the prayer made by the petitioners and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation
