1. In the present petition, the grievance of the petitioner is with regard to the financial maintenance, which has been imposed upon the petitioner as well as his brother vide order dated 28.10.2020 (Annexure P-1) and that upon an application filed by respondent-Senior Citizen, the transfer deed dated 20.09.2016 in favour of the petitioner has been set-aside by the Tribunal vide order dated 23.08.2021 (Annexure P-3).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he is ready to take care of senior citizen and keeping in view the interim order dated 02.06.2022 passed by this Court, a sum of ₹3,000/- per month is being paid



to the senior citizen by the petitioner and the petitioner submits that he will continue to pay the same.

3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No. 1-Senior Citizen submits that it is difficult for respondent No. 1-Senior Citizen to make his both ends meet with a meager amount of ₹3,000/- and in case the petitioner agrees to pay a sum of ₹10,000/- per month, he will not get the impugned order of cancellation of the transfer deed executed passed by the Tribunal and the same be modified with regard to the grant of financial assistance.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that whatever financial assistance this Court deems fit, will be paid by the petitioner to respondent No. 1-Senior Citizen as directed.

5. Keeping in view the totality of the circumstances when the parties agreed that the respondent No. 1-Senior Citizen will be satisfied with the payment of the financial maintenance, it is directed that from 01.03.2025, the Senior Citizen will be paid a sum of ₹7,500/- by 7th of every month in the bank account of the senior citizen and in turn, the respondent No. 1-Senior Citizen will not press for execution of the impugned order. In case of any default of payment by the petitioner, the senior citizen will be at liberty to file an application to revive the present petition.

6. While issuing notice of motion, a sum of ₹25,000/- was directed to be paid to the Senior Citizen as litigation expenses and in case, the same has not been paid by the petitioner, the same be also released in favour of the senior citizen within a period of eight weeks from today.

7. Writ petition is disposed of in above terms.



8. Pending miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
