1. Prayer in the present petition filed under 528 of BNSS, 2023 seeking directions to official respondent Nos.2 to 5 to not to harass the petitioner on account of anonymous complaint and to comply with the provisions of Section 160 Cr.P.C. and further prayer is to look into representation dated 23.04.2025 (Annexure P-3) moved to respondent No.2.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that after registration of FIR (*supra*), a compromise has been effected between the parties and they have filed a petition seeking quashing of the FIR (*supra*) on the basis of compromise. However, since the registration of the FIR (*supra*), the police officials are harassing the petitioner and his family members continuously. In this regard, the petitioner had earlier filed an application No.984-PGD dated 08.11.2024, but no action was taken. Thereafter on 21.04.2025 at about 5:30 AM, police officials forcibly entered the house of the petitioner and started searching. Further, they snatched their mobile phones and damaged the DVR and CCTV cameras and took away the DVR and cash amounting to



Rs.24,000/- in their vehicle. Moreover, without any warrant/order, the police officials arrested the father of the petitioner. The petitioner has submitted a representation dated 22.04.2025 (Annexure P-3) to Senior Superintendent of Police, Jalandhar, Rural, but no action was taken.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner would be satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-3) submitted by the petitioner, in a time bound manner.

4. Notice of motion to official respondents only.

5. Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents-State. Learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to supply a copy of complete paper book to learned State counsel today itself.

6. Keeping in view the prayer made by the petitioners and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-3) submitted by the petitioner and take appropriate steps in view of the submissions made therein, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.
