1. In the present petition, the petitioner has challenged the order dated 06.09.2024 (Annexure P-1) whereby, 10% pension of the petitioner has been deducted without any justification.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that a legal notice dated 31.01.2025 (Annexure P-4) has been served upon the respondents, however, no decision has been taken thereupon. He submits, on instructions from the petitioner, that at this stage, he will be satisfied if a direction is given to respondent No.3 to decide the legal notice dated 31.01.2025 (Annexure P-4) in a time bound manner.

Mr. Vikas Arora, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 and 3 and Ms. Neha Randhawa, Advocate for Mr. Parambir Singh, Advocate, also accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.2 and both of them do not oppose the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. In view of the above and without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is hereby disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 to consider and decide the legal notice dated 31.01.2025 (Annexure P-4), within a period of 08 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law. In case, the petitioner is found to be entitled to the relief as claimed in the legal notice, the same be released within a period of four weeks thereafter.
