1. Present contempt petition has been filed under Sections 10-12 of the Contempt of Courts Act 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India for not implementing the judgment dated 18.01.2025 (Annexure P-1) passed by the Division Bench of this Court.
2. Learned counsel for the respondents-UOI has submitted that in compliance to the judgment dated 18.01.2025 passed by the Division Bench, the respondent authorities has passed an order dated 27.08.2025 and has sanctioned the disability pension as prayed by the petitioner. It is further submitted that before releasing the said amount, one formality would be required to be completed by the petitioner, inasmuch as, the



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date of birth of the petitioner in the service record of the husband of the petitioner is 01.02.1957, whereas, in the Aadhar Card it has been mentioned as 01.01.1951 and thus, in the said circumstances, in case the petitioner wishes to change the date of birth in the service record of the husband, then, she would have to submit an affidavit, certified copy of the Aadhar Card and Pan Card. It is further submitted that as and when the petitioner submits the said documents, the money would be released to her within a period of two weeks therefrom.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents has handed over a copy of the letter dated 04.09.2025 to learned counsel for the petitioner requiring the petitioner to do the above-said acts.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner would do the needful but has prayed that the respondents be bound by the said statement of releasing the amount within a period of two weeks from the date the said documents are submitted.

5. Keeping in view the above-said facts and circumstances, the present contempt petition is disposed of, at this stage. The respondents would be bound by the statement made before this Court. Liberty is granted to the petitioner to revive the present contempt petition in case the respondents back-track from the said statement.
