Challenging the order dated 02.05.2025 (Annexure P-4) whereby the transfers have been made across Haryana in the Department of Haryana Roadways alleging the same to be in violation of the Online Transfer Policy 2020, the instant writ petition has been filed by the petitioners.

2 Although much emphasis has been laid by the counsel for the petitioners on the amendment in the Online Transfer Policy 2020 notified on 08.02.2024 to the effect that the transfer policy has to be made once in a year for which a time schedule has to be prescribed and to contend that the time schedule prescribed by the respondents has not been adhered to, counsel for

the petitioners was confronted as to whether the said time schedule is mandatory and as to whether non-compliance of the same would vitiate the exercise/undertaking of the process of selection/transfer, counsel for the petitioners is not in a position to refer to any law. He, however, contends that there are certain personal hardships/difficulties of various individuals which has not been taken into consideration by the said respondents.

3 Learned State counsel, on instructions from Bhupinder Ahlawat, DA, State Transport Department, Haryana, submits that in the event of the petitioners submitting representations to the respondent authorities with respect to any errors in the proposed places of posting of the petitioners/transfer orders, such representations shall be considered by the respondent authorities in a time bound manner.

4 Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners accepts the same.

5 In view of above, the instant writ petition is disposed of at this stage directing the respondents to treat the writ petition as a representation and/or any other representation(s) that may be so submitted by the petitioners within a period of 10 days from today and to take a considered decision on the issues advanced by them within a period of one month of the receipt of such representation(s).
