3. Learned State counsel submits that Government vide instructions dated 03.05.2015 read with 28.01.2025 has extended benefit of 6th Pay Commission to all the employees who had retired during 2006-2010 or prior to 2006.

5. It is made clear that if the competent authority has not paid arrears as stated above, the outstanding amount shall be cleared within 2 months from today. The said amount shall carry interest @ 6% per annum.
