1. Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for directing respondent Nos.2 and 3 to take appropriate action against the private respondents and to take action on application dated 27.05.2023.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a law abiding and peace loving citizen. He further submits that she along with her daughter is tenant in the house owned by the private respondents and there is no default in paying the rent. However, in the first week of April, 2023, the private respondents started pressurizing the petitioner and her daughter to vacate the house and on 24.04.2023, the private respondents along with some anti-social elements misbehaved with the petitioner. As such, complaint (Annexure P-1) was filed. Thereafter, the petitioner filed a civil suit and vide order dated 02.05.2023, the private respondents were restrained from dispossessing the petitioner and her daughter except due course of law. Not only this, the private respondents kept on harassing and torturing the petitioner



and her daughter. Thereafter, the incident was reported to the police and finally, FIR bearing No.768 dated 10.05.2023 under Sections 427/509 IPC was registered at Police Station Karnal Civil Lines, District Karnal (Annexure P-4) against the private respondents. He submits that the jurisdictional police authorities are not taking any action against the private respondents in spite of registration of FIR (*supra*).

3. On the other hand, learned State counsel assisted by Mr. Amaninder Preet, Advocate for respondent Nos.5 to 8 submits that in compliance of the order passed by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 16.08.2023, vacant and peaceful possession of the rented premises has been handed over to private respondents. He further submits that nothing survives in the present petition as the civil suit as well as trial of the FIR (*supra*) has been progressing. The investigating agency has already concluded the investigation and presented the final report before the Court concerned.

4. Having heard the learned counsel for the parties and in view of the fact that the investigating agency has already concluded the investigation and presented the final report, no further action is required to be passed and the present petition stands disposed of accordingly.

5. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, also stand(s) disposed of.
