SUMEET GOEL, J. (Oral)

1. Present petition has been filed under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.93 dated 04.05.2025, under Sections 108 and 3(5) of the BNS, 2023 (earlier Sections 306 and 304 of IPC) registered at Police Station City Jagraon District Ludhiana Rural.

2. On 20.05.2025 the following order was passed:-

“Contends, inter alia, that from bare reading of the FIR, no allegation is discernible that petitioners have instigated or abetted the deceased to commit suicide.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Manjot Kaur, learned AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent; seeks time to have instructions and/or to file written response in the matter.

Mr. Ritik Mahindroo, Advocate has filed Power of Attorney on behalf of the de facto complainant and which is taken on record. Registry to tag the same at appropriate place.

In the meanwhile, petitioners shall join investigation before the Investigating Officer; but they be not arrested till the next date of hearing.”

3. Learned State counsel has stated that pursuant to the order dated 20.05.2025, though the petitioners have joined investigation but their custodial interrogation is required on the ground of gravity of offence. He has filed the status report dated 20.07.2025 by way of an affidavit of Jasjyot Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Jagraon, District Ludhiana (Rural) in Court today, which is taken on record.

4. Case has been called out twice since morning. None has caused appearance on behalf of the complainant.

5. In view of above and the entirety of facts and circumstances of the case, the interim order dated 20.05.2025 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 as the petitioners have joined investigation and his custodial interrogation is only being sought for on account of the offence being serious in nature.

6. This order should not be treated as “blanket” order. It will not be read granting petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.

7. Liberty is reserved in favour of State/complainant to move for cancellation/recall of this order in case the petitioner violates any condition stipulated under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 or upon showing any other sufficient cause.



8. Needless to say that anything observed herein above shall not be construed to be an opinion on the merits of the case.
