1. Present petition has been filed by the petitioner namely Ranjit Singh alias Tinda, aged about 33 years, seeking grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.33, dated 28.03.2025, under Section(s) 109, 126(2), 117(2), 351(2), 191(3), 190 of BNS (old sections 307, 341, 325, 506, 148, 149 of IPC), registered at Police Station Dhanaula, District Barnala.

2. From the status report, it is evident that as per the Medico-Legal Report (MLR) dated 27.03.2025, injured Kuldeep Singh sustained five blunt injuries. The detailed injury report dated 26.06.2025, issued by the concerned medical officer, is reproduced hereinbelow, for reference:

- As per X-ray reporting done at GGS, Faridkot and Ortho Opinion, there is # in Distal half of shaft of tibia, # at proximal end of Fibula

and # at distal-1, 3<sup>rd</sup> of shaft of Fibula seen on X-rays. Hence injury No.1 is grievous in nature.

- No # is seen for injury no 2,3,4,5 on X-rays reporting done at GGS, Faridkot. Hence, injury No.2,3,4,5 are simple in nature.”

3. Since, the injured has sustained three fractures, and petitioner is alleged to have caused one of these injuries by inflicting a blow with an iron rod, this Court finds no sufficient ground to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in the present case. Accordingly, present petition is **dismissed**.
