Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondents for not complying the order dated 13.8.2024 (Annexure P-2) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-19621-2024 titled as “Pardeep Kumar vs. State of Haryana and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of with a direction “*....to respondents to consider and decide the legal notice dated 02.02.2024, Annexure P-4), expeditiously in accordance with law.*”

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Shri Pradeep Deswal, DRO, Rewari, submits that the order dated 13.8.2024 (Annexure P-2) shall be complied within four weeks from today.



In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner(s) does not press the present petition.

Dismissed as not pressed.

Rule stands discharged.

However, in case the needful is not done, as per undertaking, the petitioner(s) would be at liberty to seek revival of the present contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring/concerned officer(s) would be liable to pay additional sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner(s) towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application, if any.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
