1. In the present petition, the grievance being raised by the petitioner is that due to ill health, the petitioner could not appear in the final examination of the Final Secondary (10th) held in the year 2025, hence, respondents be directed to grant an opportunity to the petitioner to appear in the examination.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the benefit of appearing in the examination should be given to the petitioner by treating her absence due to medical reasons and not otherwise.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner has already raised the said grievance in the representation dated 19.03.2025 (Annexure P-4), which is still pending consideration with the respondents and the petitioner will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a direction is issued to the respondents to decide the same by passing an appropriate speaking order in a time bound manner.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. Himanshu Malik, Senior Panel Counsel, UOI, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and Mr. B.S. Seemar, Advocate, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of



CBSE and submits that in case, representation dated 19.03.2025 (Annexure P-4) has been received in the office of the concerned authorities and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority keeping in view the settled principle of law within a period of four weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of this order by passing an appropriate speaking order. In case, it is found feasible to accept the claim of the petitioner, the same will be accepted, otherwise due reasons for not accepting the claim of the petitioner will be mentioned in the speaking order so passed which order will be conveyed to the petitioner for her information and necessary action.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the statement of learned counsel for the respondents, the present petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.

6. Ordered accordingly.
