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**SUKHVINDER KAUR, J.(ORAL)**

Prayer in the instant petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is for directing the official respondents to protect the life and personal liberty of the petitioner at the hands of respondent No.5.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that the petitioner is 65 years old and a senior citizen. Husband of the petitioner has died in the year 2020 leaving behind three daughters and one son. Petitioner is a widow lady and is lawful owner of H. No.54, Village Birring, District Jalandhar but due to persistent and violent threats from her own son i.e. respondent No.5, she is presently residing on the mercy of her brother. Son of the petitioner is a habitual offender and multiple FIRs have been registered against him and husband of the petitioner in his lifetime, had disinherited respondent No.5 from his property rights due to his criminal conduct and misbehaviour. Petitioner also disinherited her son-respondent No.5 via newspaper publication (Annexures P3 & P-4) and also filed a civil suit (Annexures P-1 & P-2) for declaration to the effect that the petitioner had disowned respondent No.5. When the petitioner returned from Australia, she

was physically assaulted and illegally evicted by her son and was rendered homeless.

During the course of arguments, learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that she would be satisfied, in case, his pending representation dated 19.05.2025 (Annexure P-5) before the Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar, is decided by respondent No.3.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Gagandeep Kaur, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice and submitted that she has no objection if the aforesaid representation dated 19.05.2025(Annexure P-5) is decided.

In view of the above, the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3—Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar, to look into the representation dated 19.05.2025 (Annexure P-5), at the earliest, regarding threat perception and take necessary steps, if any required, in accordance with law, to ensure that the life and liberty of the petitioner is not jeopardized at the hands of the private respondent No.5. However, it will have no effect on any civil or criminal action, which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
