1. The prayer made in the present petition is for directing the respondents to regularise the services of the petitioner, in view of the policies issued by the Government from time to time.

2. The petitioner, who was engaged on daily wage basis as Pump Operator on 01.05.1985, having qualification of matriculation with ITI diploma, was dismissed from service on account of being convicted in a criminal case, however, he was acquitted by Hon'ble the Supreme Court vide judgment dated 26.02.2013. He was therefore, allowed to join services vide letter dated 19.02.2014, appended as Annexure P-7.

3. Reliance was placed at the time of issuance of notice of motion to the case of two similarly situated employees namely Gurjant Singh and Major Singh, who were working as Pump Operators and then dismissed due to criminal proceedings, which having been set aside on account of acquittal and they were granted benefit of regularisation vide order dated 24.11.2015, Annexure P-15. He

thus, at this stage, on instructions from the petitioner prays that his case be considered in terms of the aforesaid.

4. The aforesaid facts having been brought out, during the course of hearing, learned State counsel sought instructions and thus states that the respondents would not be averse to having a relook at the matter and decide afresh within a period of 6 months, taking note of the aforesaid submissions, which satisfies the learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. Ordered accordingly.
