SANJAY VASHISTH, J. (Oral)

1. Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, who has been booked for having committed the offences punishable under Sections 406, 420 and 120-B of IPC, in a case arising out of FIR No. 46, dated 21.04.2024, registered at Police Station Bhadson, District Patiala.

2. On 19.07.2024, the following order was passed by this Court:

“ Petitioner Jasleen Thind has filed petition under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for short ‘BNSS’) for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 46 dated 21.04.2024, under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Bhadson, District Patiala, alleging that daughter of present petitioner and son of complainant got married and ultimately shifted to Canada. At present both are residing in Canada. Due to bad habits of son of complainant, matrimonial dispute took place. All the allegations are false. She is ready to join the investigation.

Notice of motion.



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On asking of this Court, Mr. Kewal Singh, Addl. A.G. Punjab accepts notice on behalf of State and prays for an adjournment to file status report.

Adjourned to 12.09.2024, for filing status report.

In the meantime, in case petitioner is arrested, she be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer subject to the condition that petitioner will join the investigation as and when required. She will not tamper with or interfere with investigation and will not leave country without prior permission, as provided under Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.”

3. Mr. Amandeep Singh, DAG, Punjab, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and her custodial interrogation is not required for the purpose of investigation.

4. Considering the totality of facts and circumstances detailed in the present petition and also the fact that the petitioner has already joined the investigation, this Court deems it appropriate to allow the present petition. Accordingly, the ad-interim order dated 19.07.2024 is made absolute

5. However, the petitioner shall continue to join the investigation as and when required to do so and abide by all the conditions laid down under Section 482(2) of BNSS.

6. Petition is disposed of.
