This petition has been filed under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.35 dated 25.03.2025 under Sections 303(2)/318(2)/318(4)/336(2)/340(2) of BNS (Sections 341(3)/341(4)/347(1)/317(2) of BNS added later on) registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Amritsar, District Amritsar.

On 04.06.2025, the following order was passed:-

'Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia contends that the forged IDs have already been recovered and the petitioner has been roped in as an accused in the present case solely on the basis of disclosure statement. He further submits that the petitioner has no other criminal antecedents and he is ready and willing to join the investigation as and when called for and to extend all cooperation to the Investigating Agency.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Teevar Sharma, AAG Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State and prays for some time to complete instructions and file reply, if so advised.

Reply, if any, be filed on or before the adjourned date with copy in advance to the learned counsel opposite.

Adjourned to 29.07.2025.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when so required by the Investigating Agency. In the event of the petitioner joining investigation, he shall be admitted to interim bail by the arresting officer/investigating officer on his furnishing of bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/investigating officer. The petitioner(s) shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) of 2023.'

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Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Harjinder Singh, at the very outset informs the Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the statement of learned State counsel, order dated 04.06.2025 is hereby made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS (earlier Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.).

The petition stands disposed of.
