Sumeet Goel (Oral):

1. Apprehending his arrest in FIR No.66 dated 14.05.2025 registered for offences punishable under Sections 115, 117(2), 3(5), 351(2) of BNS 2023 (Sections 115, 117(2), 351(3), 3(5), 110 & 61 (2) of BNS 2023 mentioned in impugned order) at Police Station BPTP, District Faridabad; the petitioner has preferred this petition under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking pre-arrest bail.

2. On 06.06.2025, the following order was passed:

“Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Samarth Sagar, Addl. AG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the State.

List on 11.08.2025.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) BNSS, 2023.”

3. Learned State counsel (on instructions from ASI Joginder Singh) has submitted that the petitioner has joined investigation and he is not required for further custodial interrogation.

4. Keeping in view the factual milieu of the case in hand, especially the factum of the petitioner having joined investigation and he is not required for further custodial interrogation, the petition is allowed and the order dated 06.06.2025 granting interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner is hereby made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 482(2) of BNSS.

5. This order should not be treated as “blanket” order. It will not be read granting petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.

6. Liberty is reserved in favour of State/complainant to move for cancellation/recall of this order in case the petitioner violates any condition stipulated under Section 482(2) of BNSS or upon showing any other sufficient cause.

7. Needless to say that anything observed herein above shall not be construed to be an opinion on the merits of the case.

8. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
