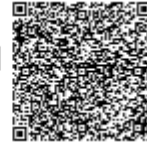

1. Learned counsel appearing for respondents No.5 to 7 submits that father of petitioner No.1 has met her in the office of DSP and as such, there is no requirement to compel her presence to appear before this Court in terms of the previous order dated 23.06.2025.

2. Having married against the wishes of their family members, petitioners are now apprehending threat to their life and liberty at the hands of private respondents No.5 to 9 and have prayed for granting them protection by way of this petition.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that both the petitioners are major and have performed marriage on 05.06.2025. Copy of marriage certificate is (Annexure P-4). Ever since then, the petitioners are being threatened



with dire consequences by the private respondents. Resultantly, a representation dated 05.06.2025 was also made to respondent No.2- Superintendent of Police, Sirsa for protection of their lives and liberty but in vain. Learned counsel submits that he would be satisfied if directions are issued to respondent No.2- Superintendent of Police, Sirsa to look into their representation and take appropriate steps at the earliest.

- 3. Notice of motion to official respondents.
- 4. Ms. Vasundhara Dalal, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of official respondents.
- 5. In view of above, petition is hereby disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2- Superintendent of Police, Sirsa to provide necessary protection to the petitioners after considering threat perceptions to their life and liberty and to ensure that the life and liberty of the petitioners is not jeopardized at the hands of the private respondents. However, this direction will not validate the marriage said to have taken place between the parties and will have no effect on any civil or criminal action, which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
- 6. Pending application (s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
