1. This petition has been filed under Section 482 of BNSS for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No. 0022 dated 04.04.2025 under Sections 21,29 of NDPS Act, 1985 registered at Police Station Majitha, District Amritsar Rural.
2. The case of the prosecution is that 31.15 grams of heroin was recovered from the co-accused namely Dilpreet Singh, who has disclosed the name of the present petitioner as the supplier of the contraband.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case only on the basis of disclosure statement made by the co-accused. The petitioner has nothing to do with the alleged allegations. He further submits that there is no direct or indirect evidence to connect the petitioner with the present case except the disclosure statement made by the co-accused.
4. Notice of motion.
5. Mr. Kamalpreet Bawa, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the

respondent-State. He has opposed the prayer made by the learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that the petitioner is involved in two more cases under NDPS Act.

6. I have heard the submissions made by the learned counsel for the parties and gone through the record.

7. Keeping in view the fact that the petitioner is involved in two more cases under the NDPS Act, which shows that the petitioner is a habitual offender and has criminal antecedents, no ground is made out to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the present petition stands dismissed.
