Present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for short 'BNSS') for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner in FIR No.41 dated 13.04.2025, under Sections 109, 351(2) read with Section 3 (5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (for short 'BNS'), registered at Police Station Banur, District SAS Nagar (Mohali).

2. Allegations are that petitioner alongwith other co-accused in furtherance of their common intention inflicted several injuries on the person of *de facto*-complainant-Lovepreet Singh with an attempt to kill him.

3. Contends that petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case and he is ready to join investigation, but he be protected. Further contends that no offence under Section 109 of the BNS is made out against petitioner as injuries on the person of complainant are not dangerous to life.

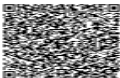
4. *Per contra*, learned State counsel vehemently opposed the prayer while submitting that petitioner gave head injury to the complainant-

Lovepreet Singh which is grievous in nature and injured is 17 years of age. Apart that, 04 other criminal cases are pending against petitioner and details of the same are as under:-

5. Learned State counsel has produced copy of MLR dated 12.04.2025 of complainant-Lovepreet Singh, which is taken on record as Mark 'X'. Registry to tag the same at appropriate place. Nature of injuries received by complainant as shown in his MLR is as under:-

6. Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the paperbook.
7. It transpires that petitioner gave a blow on the vital part of complainant-Lovepreet Singh(minor) with an intention to kill him. Although, final medical opinion in the matter is still awaited; but *prima facie*, allegations against petitioner are serious in nature and moreover, his credentials are also not clean, being involved in other criminal cases.
8. In view of above, this Court is not inclined to grant pre-arrest bail to the petitioner.
9. Consequently, petition is dismissed.
10. Above observations be not construed as an expression of opinion on merits of the present case, in any manner.
