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SHEEL NAGU, CJ. (Oral)

1. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in respect of offence punishable under Sections 115(2), 118(2), 126(2) and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 in FIR No.127 dated 31.03.2025 registered at Police Station City Kharar, District SAS Nagar.

2. The allegations against the petitioner are that he had thrown a brickbat at the complainant at close quarters, resulting in sustenance of injury on the forehead and thereafter, the petitioner again threw another brick-bat at the complainant inflicting injury on the right hand which was used by the complainant to ward off the brickbat from hitting the head. The injury No.2 (on the hand) is categorized as 'grievous'.

3. Considering the aforesaid that the grievous injury is on non-vital part of the body and also that the petitioner has no criminal



antecedents, as informed by the learned counsel for the State, this Court extends the benefit of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to his furnishing personal bonds for a sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Arresting/ Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and co-operate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. In case the petitioner does not join the investigation, the State is free to move an application for cancellation of his bail.

4. This order shall also remain subject to the following condition:-

(i) During monsoon season, the petitioner shall plant 10 saplings of indigenous plants at a public place and submit proof in that regard by way of photographs before the concerned Police Station where the FIR has been registered within a period of 15 days and if there is no such intimation submitted or intimation is found to be incorrect, then the State can move an application for cancellation of his bail.

5. The petition stands allowed.
