At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the age of petitioner No.2 has been wrongly mentioned as 20 years in the petition.

Permission is granted to correct the age of the petitioner(s). The Registry is directed to re-scan the petition and replace the earlier scanned copy with the corrected one

By way of present petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioners are seeking issuance of directions to the official respondents to protect their life and liberty at the hands of respondents No.4 & 5.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Aditi Girdhar, learned Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, who is present in Court on advance copy, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondent(s).



As per the petitioners, they have married on 05.06.2025 against the wishes of respondents No.4 & 5, who happen to be the family members of petitioner No.1.

Both the petitioners have claimed themselves to be major relying upon Aadhar cards indicating that petitioner No.1-Khushnuma is 01.01.2006 born and petitioner No.2-Nayyum is 05.01.1998 born.

Without commenting on the legality and validity of the marriage, and keeping in view that the petitioners are wagers, the present petition is allowed. However, liberty is granted to respondents No.4 & 5 to challenge the legality of marriage on the grounds being pleaded.

Further, keeping in view the fact that both the petitioners claim to have married, I deem it appropriate to direct respondent No.2 to look into the representation dated 05.06.2025 (Annexure P-4) submitted by the petitioners. And, if possible, may call a meeting of the petitioners as well as respondents No.4 & 5 in his presence, so that the parties get rid off their ill feelings and live amicably.

The petition stands disposed off.
