1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in a case FIR No. 36, dated 23.02.2025, under Sections 109(1), 333, 115(2), 126(2), 351(3), 190,191(3) of B.N.S, Section 117(2) of B.N.S added later on, registered at Police Station Amargarh, District Malerkotla.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that as per the complainant, the petitioner was armed with *Gandasa* and had caused injury with a fist on the lips of the complainant. He further contends that in fact, the allegations levelled by the complainant are highly unbelievable. Even the injured Harpreet Singh had suffered four injuries and only one injury has been declared to be grievous in nature, which has been attributed to the main accused. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that in the present case, similarly placed co-accused Lovepreet Singh and Purbdeep Singh @

Prabhdeep Singh have been granted the concession of interim anticipatory bail by this Court vide order (Annexure P-3). The petitioner is in custody for the last more than 04 months.

3. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that four more cases were ordered to be registered against the petitioner.

4. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully in the present case.

5. In fact, Harpreet Singh, injured had suffered four injuries and the injury which is attributed to the petitioner has been declared to be simple in nature. The petitioner is in custody for the last about 04 months. Moreover, two co-accused namely Lovepreet Singh and Purbdeep Singh @ Prabhdeep Singh, who were assigned similar roles, have been granted the concession of interim anticipatory bail by this Court.

6. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate.
