1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant of regular bail to him in case FIR No. 385, dated 25.10.2024, registered under Sections 15-C of NDPS Act, Sections 27-A,29 of NDPS Act added lateron, Police Station Hansi Sadar, District Hansi (Annexure P-1).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that as per the case of the prosecution, Major Singh and Ajaib Singh were apprehended by the police, while they were carrying 50 kg 283 grams of of poppy husk in a truck and they were arrested. The petitioner has been named as an accused in the present case on the basis of the disclosure statement suffered by his co-accused. Except that there is no other evidence against the petitioner. The petitioner was arrested in the present case on 11.05.2025 and is in custody since then. Learned counsel further submits that co-accused Bittu Singh @ Bantu Singh and Major Singh have already been granted the concession of bail by this Court on 22.07.2025.

3. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that serious allegations have been levelled against the present petitioner and he does not deserve the concession of bail by this Court.

4. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully.

5. It is not in dispute that two co-accused Bittu Singh @ Bantu Singh and Major Singh have already been admitted to bail by this Court on 22.07.2025. Moreover, the petitioner is stated to be in custody for the last more than two months. Thus, further custody of the petitioner will not serve any meaningful purpose.

6. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on bail pending trial on his furnishing bail bonds and surety to the satisfaction of the concerned trial Court/ Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate.
