SUMEET GOEL, J. (Oral)

1. The present petition has been filed under Section 528 of BNSS for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.2 to 3, with the following substantive prayer:

“It is, therefore, respectfully prayed that present petition may kindly be allowed and directions may kindly be issued to respondents no.2 to 3 to not to interfere in the peaceful life of the petitioner especially respondent no.3 to 4 who by misusing their official position is threatening and harassing the petitioner despite the fact that petitioner has no connection with the FIR No.49 dated 27.02.2021 (Annexure P-1) under section 420, 406 IPC and under section 13 of Punjab Travel professionals (Regulation) Act 2014 Police Station Sadar, District Amritsar and the petitioner was already found innocent in the preliminary inquiry conducted by the investigation agency, in the interest of justice.

It is further prayed that directions may kindly be issued to respondent no.3 to comply with the mandatory requirements of Section 179 BNSS (previously read as 160 Cr.P.C.) in case the attendance of petitioner is required in the police station, in the interest of justice.

It is further prayed that directions may kindly be issued to respondent no.2 to consider the written representation (Annexure P-3) moved by the petitioner as per law in a time bound manner, in the interest of justice.”

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner limits his prayer and submits that the petitioner would be satisfied, for the *nonce*, if a direction is issued to



respondent No.2 to consider and take a conscious decision on the representation (Annexure P-3) made by the petitioner in a time bound manner.

- 3. Notice of motion.
- 4. On the strength of the advance notice, Mr. Jatinder Pal Singh, Senior DAG Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents. He submits he has no objection in case the limited prayer made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, at this stage, is accepted.
- 5. I have heard learned counsel for the rival parties and have perused the paper-book with their assistance.
- 6. Keeping in view the entirety of facts and circumstances of the case & without going into merits thereof, the instant petition is disposed of with a direction to the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar (respondent No.2 herein) to look into the representation (Annexure P-3) moved by the petitioner; objectively consider the grievance(s) raised in the said representation & take ratiocinated decision thereupon after affording opportunity of hearing to petitioner, in accordance with law, within a period of two weeks from today. Such decision be communicated to the petitioner within fifteen days of it being taken.
- 7. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
