1. At the very outset, learned counsel for the respondent-State that pursuant to the order dated 05.09.2022 passed by the Writ Court in CWP-19838-2022 the respondents have been directed to consider the legal notice dated 08.08.2022 and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order within a period of eight weeks. It was further directed that after the decision, in case petitioner is found entitled to the retiral dues, the same be released to him within a further period of six weeks, thereafter.

2. Learned counsel points out that as stated in the short reply dated 22.11.2023 filed by way of an affidavit of respondent No.4, a speaking order dated 16.12.2022 (Annexure R-1) was passed; thereafter cheques dated

01.06.2023 and 26.10.2023 for an amount of Rs.3,50,000/- & Rs.1,50,000/- respectively (Annexure R-2) have also been released to the petitioner. It is submitted that thereafter nothing is due to the petitioner.

3. It is pointed out that details of the payments made are borne in at page 15 of the abovesaid short reply filed by respondent No.4. Even further payments have been made to the petitioner, in the following manner:-

4. Thereby, a total payment of Rs.6,55,413/- has been made to the petitioner.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he has no instructions in this regard.

6. In view of the statements made by learned State counsel no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same stands **disposed of** accordingly.

7. Rule stands discharged.

8. In case, any cause of action survives, the petitioner is at liberty to revive the present petition within a period of two weeks from today.

9. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
