1. Present appeal has been filed under Section 14-A of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.51 dated 22.04.2025, under Section 3(1)(s) of the SC/ST Act and Section 351(2) of BNSS, 2023, registered at Police Station IT City, SAS Nagar, Punjab.
2. Mr. Neeraj Madaan, learned Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, appears on advance notice and points out that the present appeal is not maintainable under Section 14-A of the SC/ST Act, as the anticipatory bail application filed before the Court of Sessions was withdrawn by appellant himself on 04.07.2025.
3. In view of the legal objection raised by the learned State counsel, the present appeal is held to be not maintainable and is accordingly disposed of, with liberty to the appellant to avail of appropriate remedy in accordance with law.
