In compliance of order dated 24.07.2025, status report by way of an affidavit of Prithvi Singh Chahal, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police (City-1), District SAS Nagar, has been filed on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4 and the same is taken on record.

It has been alleged in the status report that on 06.06.2025, the petitioner had submitted a written complaint against respondents No.5 to 7 for taking appropriate legal action against them for beating him. On 06.06.2025 itself, respondent No.5 had also got registered DDR No.37 against the petitioner and also submitted a written complaint against the petitioner for taking appropriate legal action against him. Regarding the said complaints, petitioner and his driver Gurpreet Singh were got medico legally examined from Civil Hospital, Mohali and their MLRs were obtained. Respondent No.5 also got himself examined from Civil Hospital, Mohali and produced his MLR. During pendency of the preliminary enquiry into the aforesaid complaints, the petitioner and his father Devjeet Singh entered into a written compromise on 07.06.2025 with respondents No.5 to

7, as per which they agreed not to initiate criminal action against the said respondents and the said respondents also agreed not to initiate legal action against the petitioner. So, both the aforesaid complaints No.6209/S/SSP dated 30.07.2025 and No.2924/RPC dated 12.08.2025 were received from the petitioner for taking action against respondents No.5 to 7 for the alleged incident dated 06.06.2025. The said complaints were entrusted for preliminary enquiry to the SHO, Police Station Mathaur, District SAS Nagar. The SHO conducted the preliminary enquiry into the aforesaid complaints and submitted his report dated 25.08.2025 before the deponent stating therein that apart from the facts narrated above and from the perusal of the medico legal report of the petitioner, only offence under Section 115(2) of BNS is made out, which is not cognizable in nature and no other evidence had come to light which could prove the allegations levelled by the petitioner or commission of any other offence by respondents No.5 to 7. Thus, the petitioner can take recourse to his legal remedies before the appropriate Court of law. Finding no action required to be taken by the police on the said complaints, it had been recommended to file/ close the said complaints. The said report is pending consideration before the senior officers and shall soon be taken to its logical conclusion.

So, keeping in view the aforesaid status report, no further order is required to be passed.

Present petition stands disposed of accordingly.
