1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in case FIR No.81, dated 29.12.2024, registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109, 351(2), 324(4), 191(3), 190 of B.N.S, Police Station Dharamgarh, Sangrur.

2. Learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of petitioner submits that in the present case, it has been falsely alleged that the petitioner had caused an injury with an iron rod on the head of Pardeep. He next contends that even though the said injury has been declared to be dangerous to life, but, Pardeep, injured has been discharged from the hospital. By referring to the compromise deed (Annexure P-3), he submits that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties and all the parties are rustic villagers. Even the fight had taken place at the spur of the moment and there is no mens rea on the part of the present petitioner. Learned counsel has further referred to the order dated

29.07.2025 passed by this Court in CRM-M-39395-2025, whereby, similarly placed co-accused Manpreet Singh @ Peeta has been granted the concession of bail. He next contends that the charge has already been framed against the petitioner and no witness has been examined so far. Thus, further custody of the petitioner will not serve any meaningful purpose.

4. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that the petitioner is the main accused, however, he admits that co-accused Manpreet Singh @ Peeta has been granted the concession of bail.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

6. In the present case, it is not in dispute that co-accused Manpreet Singh @ Peeta, Lakhwinder Singh, Gurwinder Singh and Bhudhvir Singh @ Gudhu @ Yudhvir Singh have been granted the concession of bail by this Court. In the present case, Pardeep, injured has already been discharged from the hospital and is hale and hearty. The petitioner is stated to be in custody for the last about 06 months and no witness has been examined so far. Moreover, the matter has been amicably settled between the parties, vide the compromise deed (Annexure P-3).

7. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on bail pending trial on his furnishing bail bonds and surety to the satisfaction of the concerned trial Court/ Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate.
