HARSIMRAN SINGH SETHI J. (ORAL)

1. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in the present writ petition, the only grievance of the petitioners is that there is an illegal plying of three-wheelers/auto rickshaws on the route on which the petitioners have been granted permit to operate the buses and the illegal plying of the three-wheelers/auto rickshaws is causing financial prejudice to the petitioners, which should be checked by the authorities concerned so that the petitioners do not suffer any prejudice.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that the grievance raised in the present petition has already been raised by the petitioners in the legal notice dated 01.08.2024(Annexure P-6) which is

still pending consideration with the respondents and the petitioners will be satisfied at this stage in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide the said legal notice by passing an appropriate speaking order.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that in case the legal notice dated 01.08.2024(Annexure P-6) has been received in the office of the concerned authorities and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority within a period of eight weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of this order by passing an appropriate speaking order and in case, after the decision any relief is to be extended to the petitioners, the same will be extended, otherwise due reasons will be mentioned in the speaking order to be passed for not accepting the claim of the petitioners for their information and necessary action.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the statement of learned State counsel, the present writ petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.

5. Ordered accordingly.
