JASJIT SINGH BEDI, J. (Oral)

The prayer in the present Criminal Writ Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Section 528 of the BNSS, 2023 is for the protection of the life and liberty of the petitioner and her family members, issuance of directions to the official respondents to initiate proceedings against the police officials, District Sri Muktsar Sahib for the illegal detention of her father and to take appropriate steps against the private respondents who tried to illegally trespass into the petitioner's property despite a stay order of a Civil Court.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that civil proceedings were initiated by the petitioner against the private respondents before the Court of the Civil Judge, Junior Division, Gidderbaha where interim injunction was granted in favour of the petitioner. Despite the



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aforementioned order, the erring police officials detained her father illegally whereas the private respondents tried to illegally trespass into the petitioner’s property. Therefore, appropriate directions be issued by this Court in terms of the prayer made.

3. The learned counsel for the State on instructions from ASI Jagdish Singh, on the other hand, contends that the private respondent No.6-Azadpal Singh had filed a complaint against the present petitioner-Karamjeet Kaur regarding the land in question and for the said purpose, Pritam Singh, the father of the petitioner, joined the enquiry proceedings. Therefore, no action is called for. If the petitioner is aggrieved, she may avail her civil and criminal remedies in accordance with law.

4. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

5. Admittedly, civil proceedings are pending between the parties. A complaint was submitted by the private respondent No.6-Azadpal Singh against the petitioner-Karamjeet Kaur, for which her father-Pritam Singh had joined the enquiry proceedings before the police. At this stage, no further orders are required to be passed in the attending facts and circumstances.

6. However, the petitioner is free to avail her remedies under civil and criminal law, if so required.

7. The present petition stands disposed of.
