SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE, (ORAL)

1. This petition has been filed as Public Interest Litigation by Association of Veterinary and Animal Science Teachers at the Lala Lajpat Rai University, raising the alleged public cause that despite having deficiencies of different nature, respondent No.4-College imparting education in Bachelors of Veterinary Science subject, is allowed to operate and admit students by the respondent-University in an unlawful manner. The challenge is to Annexure P-6 by which, despite the College suffering

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innumerable deficiencies in its infrastructure as well as other facets, was allowed to rectify the deficiencies until 31.12.2024 without restraining the College from continuing its operations.

2. During the pendency of this petition, response has been filed by respondent No.3-University, which is accompanied by an order dated 20.09.2024 (Annexure R-3/3) revealing that the Collage in question was inspected on 13.09.2024 and found to have complied with the requirements as per law. The said report of the Expert Committee has been accepted by the University, by imposing waiving fine of Rs.20 lacs imposed earlier. Furthermore, the restriction placed on fresh admissions for the academic year 2024-2025 has been lifted.

3. Considering the subsequent developments which have taken place by passing of the order dated 20.09.2024, this Court is of the considered view that the cause raised herein has become infructuous, therefore, the petition stands disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to re-visit the Court in case the College in question is found to be still operating without completing the formalities as per law.
