MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The instant petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India read with Section 3(1)(d) of the Punjab Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1962 seeking issuance of directions to the respondents to grant parole for 8 weeks to the petitioner as he needs to look after his ailing mother and family members.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has ailing mother, who requires constant care and has to be taken to hospital for regular checkups. Learned counsel submits that petitioner's family is dependent upon him. He further submits that the petitioner had made request for parole before respondent No.2 on 15.05.2025. Respondent No.2 referred his application to respondent No.3, who further referred the same to respondent No.4 for inquiry. However, till date, no action has been taken on the parole application of the petitioner.



3. Notice of motion to the official respondents only.
4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. A.S. Mander, Addl. A.G., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents.
5. In view of the limited prayer of the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of with direction to respondent No.4 i.e. Senior Superintendent, Gurdaspur to look into the letter dated 04.06.2025 (Annexure P-1), and decide the same expeditiously and preferably within a period of four weeks from the date of the order.
