1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in case FIR No. 204, dated 25.06.2025, registered under Sections 306,316(3), 3(5) of B.N.S, Sections 317(2), 238, 318(4), 336(2), 336(3) and 340(2) of B.N.S added later on, Police Station Bawal, District Rewari (Annexure P-1).
2. The F.I.R in the present case was registered on the basis of the statement made by Sanjeev and the same has been reproduced below:-

*“Application Date 25th June 2025. To the Incharge,
Police Station Bawal, Haryana. Sub: Application for registration
of FIR with regard to theft of trolley and parts from company
premises. Sir, It is respectfully submitted that in our company M/s
JRG Automotive Industries India Pvt. Ltd, Bawal, Dhillon
Transport is transporting our material to the end customer in their*

vehicles. The material consists Trolley and other parts. On return, only trolleys were being returned to the company. Recently, during inventory inspection of the company, it is found that many trolleys are missing. After conducting indepth enquiry, it came to fore that driver of Dhillon Transport namely Bijender is selling empty trolleys to a junk dealer for the last many days and thereafter, by making manipulation in company invoices, allowing the vehicles to enter. Parts were also being stolen from the company. In this misappropriation, an employee of the company namely Keshav Kumar is also conniving with said driver Bijender. Both were selling parts together. Driver Bijender used to keep parts with trolley outside and sell the same to outsiders. Till today 130 trolleys have been found missing out of which in respect of 83 trolleys, manipulated invoice copies are attached herewith. Value of stolen trolleys come to Rs.32,50,000/-. We came to know about this theft on 5th June 2025. When our team counted the material, above said trolleys and material was found missing. You are therefore, requested to register FIR in this matter and take necessary legal action and loss suffered by the company be got compensated. Thanking you, sd/-Sanjeev c/o JRG Automotive Ltd. Bawal, Industries.

3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that in the present case, the police had wrongly arrested the petitioner on 25.06.2025 and he is in custody since then. He further contends that the investigation in the present case is almost complete and the challan is likely to be presented against

him. Learned counsel next contends that in fact, the petitioner was an employee of the complainant company and had discharge his duties honestly, however, due to some dispute with his superior officers, he was made a scapegoat in the present case. He next contends that all the offences in the present case are triable by the Court of Magistrate and the conclusion of the trial may take quite a long time.

4. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully.

6. In the present case, the petitioner was arrested in the present case on 25.06.2025 and is in custody since then. Even, the recovery of incriminating material has already been effected from him and the challan is likely to be presented shortly. Further, there is no evidence to show that the petitioner may either tamper with the prosecution evidence or may fleeing from the process of justice.

7. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on bail pending trial on his furnishing bail bonds and surety to the satisfaction of the concerned trial Court/ Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate.
