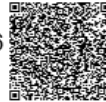

1. Through instant application under Section 11(6) of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (for short '**1996 Act**'), the applicant is seeking appointment of an Arbitrator.
2. As per office report, the respondent stands served. On 05.03.2025, there was no representation of the respondent and in the interest of justice, the matter was adjourned for today. Even today, there is no change in the situation. It appears that respondent has opted to abstain from joining the proceedings before this Court. The matter is pending before this Court since September' 2024 and it cannot be kept pending for indefinite period especially when the prayer in the application is confined to appointment of an Arbitrator who ultimately would adjudicate rights and liabilities of the parties. Thus, this Court is left with no other option except to adjudicate the case.

3. The parties entered into arbitration agreement dated 01.05.2019. A dispute erupted between the parties. The applicant served notice upon the respondent invoking arbitration clause but to no avail.

4. Conditions to invoke power conferred by Section 11(6) of 1996 Act stand satisfied, thus, I hereby appoint a sole Arbitrator to adjudicate the dispute between the parties.

5. Mr. V.K. Maheshwari, Principal Judge (Retd.), Family Court, Delhi, residing at House No.85, Sector 30, Gurugram- 122001, Mobile No.9910384671 is hereby appointed as a Sole Arbitrator to adjudicate the dispute between the parties, subject to compliance of statutory requirements. The learned Arbitrator is requested to comply with mandate of Section 12 of 1996 Act before proceeding further.

6. The parties at the first instance will appear before the Arbitrator on 07.05.2025 at 10.00 A.M. and thereafter as directed by learned Arbitrator.

7. The Arbitrator shall be paid fee in accordance with the Fourth Schedule of the 1996 Act, as amended.

8. The Arbitrator is requested to complete the proceedings as per time limit specified under Section 29-A of the 1996 Act.

9. Needless to mention, parties would be at liberty to raise all the claims/defences/counter claims/pleas before the Arbitrator. Any observation made hereinabove will not be binding on the learned Arbitrator.
