The prayer in the present petition under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 is for the grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.168 dated 08.10.2024 under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 190, 191(3) of BNS, 2023 and Sections 238 and 117(2) of BNS, 2023 (added later on) registered at Police Station City 2 Mansa, District Mansa.

2. At the very outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner contends that a compromise has been arrived at between the parties and therefore, the petitioner be granted the concession of bail, moreso, when he is in custody since 02.07.2025 but none of the prosecution witness has been examined so far and that a co-accused/Amritpal Singh alias Babbu has been granted the concession of regular bail vide order dated 22.07.2025 (Annexure P-3).

3. The learned counsel for the complainant does not dispute the factum of a compromise having been arrived at between the parties and submits that he has no objection if the petitioner is granted the concession of bail.

4. The learned counsel for the State, on the other hand, has vehemently opposed the bail application stating that the allegations levelled against the petitioner are serious in nature. He, however, concedes that a compromise has been effected between the parties and a co-accused has been granted the similar relief..

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

6. In view of the fact that a compromise has been arrived at between the parties, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner incarcerated, moreso, when a co-accused/Amritpal Singh alias Babbu has been granted the concession of bail.

7. Thus, without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner, namely, Happy Singh alias Fauji ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.

8. The present petition stands disposed of.
