SHALINI SINGH NAGPAL J. (Oral)

1. Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case arising out of FIR No. 448 dated 08.07.2025, under Section 108 Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Police Station Chandani Bagh, District Panipat. This is his first petition for anticipatory bail.

2. Complainant-father of the deceased stated that his daughter Manisha, aged 22 years, who was working as a nurse in Bengaluru, had taken admission in Prem Medical College, Panipat. She married Vikas son of Rakesh resident of Bapauli Panipat after attaining the age of majority in the year 2021 and lived with him for about three years. After that, Vikas left for his village and did not return. Therefore, his daughter came to Panipat on 04.07.2025 and took a room in Sumedha Hotel, Sanjay Chowk, Panipat, where Vikas harassed his daughter and forced her to die, on account of which his daughter



consumed celphos in the night of 05.07.2025 and died on 07.07.2025, during treatment.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner performed marriage with deceased-Manisha, who was nursing student in Prem Medical College, Panipat and they lived together for about three years. He further submitted that the deceased came to Panipat on 04.07.2025 and booked a room in Sumedha Hotel, Sanjay Chowk, Panipat. In fact, petitioner never visited the hotel on the day of occurrence and had no role in the commission of suicide by her. Referring to the copies of WhatsApp chats, Annexure P-2, he submitted that deceased was in relationship with another person and had been frequently in touch with him. He further submitted that the deceased committed suicide on account of the relationship with another person and petitioner neither had any mensrea nor any role in the commission of suicide. Further, petitioner was ready and willing to join investigation and cooperate with the police.

4. Vide order dated 13.08.2025 passed by this Court, the petitioner was granted interim bail and was directed to join investigation.

5. Learned State counsel has filed status report by way of affidavit of Suresh Kumar, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Traffic, Panipat on behalf of respondent-State and on instructions from SI Rajender, submits that petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for further investigation.

6. Considering all relevant facts and circumstances of the case, but without commenting on merits, the petition is allowed and order dated 13.08.2025, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023.
