RUPINDERJIT CHAHAL, J. (ORAL)

1. Through the instant petition filed under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (For short "BNSS"), the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR No.403 dated 30.11.2024 under Section 108 BNS, registered at Police Station City Kharar, District SAS Nagar.

2. On 25.08.2025, following order had been passed: -

“ Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 of the BNSS, 2023 is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.403 dated 30.11.2024 registered under Section 108 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, at Police Station City Kharar, District SAS Nagar. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case and she is daughter-in-law of the complainant. He argued that as per the case of the prosecution, the son of the complainant had committed suicide due to harassment and torture by the petitioner.

Learned counsel further contends that there was a matrimonial discord between the petitioner and son of the complainant. The allegations as entailed in the FIR do not satisfy the ingredients of Section 108 of BNS. The discord between the petitioner and the deceased stemmed from household issue. The



deceased was an alcoholic person due to which the life of the petitioner and her son was being acutely affected. The deceased was not earning enough to subsist a decent life style, the petitioner in order to earn livelihood used to travel to Dubai and used to send money to the deceased who was in India. The petitioner returned to India in July 2024 pursuant to which the petitioner and the deceased had lot of fights between them. On 07.08.2024, the deceased came home under the influence of alcohol and starting demanding money from the petitioner and on refusal, gave merciless beatings to the petitioner and eventually threw her out of the house along with the child in the middle of the night. Thereafter, the petitioner approached the police authority and made representation dated 27.08.2024. The petitioner and the deceased have been living separately since 07.08.2024. The deceased in the petition filed under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 has stated that the petitioner had abandoned her matrimonial home. He has further submitted that the petitioner is ready and willing to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so by the investigating agency.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Ravinder Singh, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State and seeks time to file status report in the matter.

Adjourned to 25.09.2025.

In the meantime, the petitioner is directed to join investigation within a week from today and would appear as and when required by the Investigating Officer and cooperate with the Investigating Agency. In the event of arrest, she shall be admitted to interim bail on furnishing of bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the order dated 25.08.2025 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

4. Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Daljeet Singh, has submitted that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is no longer required for further investigation.

5. In view of the statement made by learned State counsel, the interim order dated 25.08.2025 is made absolute. The petitioner shall continue to join investigation, as and when called by the Investigating Officer and shall also abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the BNSS.
