1. Present civil writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of *mandamus* directing the respondent-Corporation to sanction 100% provisional pension of the petitioner w.e.f. 01.09.2019 and release the arrears thereof from the said date till the date of actual payment along with interest @21%.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied, if the legal notice dated 12.11.2024 (Annexure P-4) served upon the respondent and the representation dated 17.03.2025 (Annexure P-5) submitted by him are decided by the respondent by passing a speaking order in a time bound manner.



3. At this stage, Mr. Manbir Singh Batth, Advocate appears on behalf of the respondent and submits that he has no objection, in case a direction is issued to the respondent to consider and decide the legal notice dated 12.11.2024 (Annexure P-4) and the representation dated 17.03.2025 (Annexure P-5) in a time bound manner, by passing a speaking order.

4. In view of the limited prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner, present petition is disposed of and the respondent is directed to consider and decide the legal notice dated 12.11.2024 (Annexure P-4) and the representation dated 17.03.2025 (Annexure P-5) and pass a speaking order, after affording an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

5. Further, the decision taken on the legal notice dated 12.11.2024 (Annexure P-4) and the representation dated 17.03.2025 (Annexure P-5) shall be conveyed to the petitioner.

6. Needless to say, if the petitioner is found entitled to the relief sought, the same be granted to him forthwith by the competent authority.
