1. Report received from Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court, according to which, matter has been settled between the parties and Settlement/Agreement arrived at between the parties dated 21.05.2025 is also annexed.

2. Status report is already filed. Learned counsel representing complainant also confirmed the terms of compromise arrived at between the parties before Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

3. Learned counsel representing petitioner states that he was granted *interim* bail vide order dated 10.10.2024 passed by the Coordinate Bench and he is still ready to join investigation as and when required.

4. In the light of aforesaid factual position, no purpose would be served by sending petitioner behind the bars. He is still ready and willing to join investigation and cooperate with Investigating Agency. Considering



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the factum of compromise arrived at between the parties and aforesaid factual position, *interim* bail already granted in favour of petitioner vide order dated 10.10.2024 in FIR No. 83 dated 07.09.2024 under Section 406, 498-A, 120-B, 354-A, 506 of IPC registered at Police Station Women, District Patiala, stands confirmed subject to same terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

- 5. Petition is, accordingly, allowed.
- 6. Pending miscellaneous application, if any, shall also stands disposed of accordingly.
