KULDEEP TIWARI, J.(ORAL)

1. Through the instant writ petition, cast under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, a prayer is made for issuance of a *mandamus*, upon the respondent No.1, to release the funds of Rs.15,00,000/- for treatment of liver transplantation of her husband, at PGIMER, Chandigarh, in pursuance to the representation dated 10.06.2025 (Annexure P-9), submitted to the respondent No.2.

2. The petitioner was employed with Jawandsons Private Limited Company, since 16.11.2021. By virtue of her employment, she is insured with Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC), under Policy No.2614302264, with registration dated 27.11.2021, and the details of the family members have also been mentioned in the ESIC e-Pehchan Card, which includes her husband, two unmarried daughters, and one minor son.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there is a continuous deduction contributed to ESIC Scheme, as per the prescribed terms

and conditions, for the financial year 2024-2025. The petitioner's husband is suffering from a serious ailment, which requires immediate liver transplantation. The husband of the petitioner was referred to the PGIMER, Chandigarh. On 19.05.2025, during his check-up, it was opined by the Doctor concerned, that he requires liver transplantation, and the estimated expenditure which is to be incurred, would be Rs.15,00,000/-. The petitioner stated that she has approached the authorities concerned, however, till date, no action has been taken by the respondents, on her representation (supra).

4. This Court has heard the submissions as made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, and has also gone through the paper book with his able assistance and the available record.

5. Considering the urgency involved and the innocuous prayer made during the course of the arguments, this Court, deems it apt to pass a *mandamus*, upon the competent respondent amongst the respondents, to forthwith, examine the representation/case of the petitioner, and thereafter, take a final decision thereof.

6. In view of the above, the instant writ petition is **disposed of** with the aforesaid *mandamus*. However, it is made clear that the above said exercise shall be done, within a period of ten days, from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

7. Ordered accordingly.
