SUVIR SEHGAL, J. (ORAL)

1. Instant petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, *inter alia*, for directing the officials respondents to protect the business of the petitioner from the wrongdoers. Another prayer has been made for initiating action against private respondents No. 5 to 9 and for directing the respondents to decide representation dated 22.08.2025, Annexure P-5.

2. Advance copy of the petition has been served upon the official respondents.

3. Additional Standing counsel, UT, Chandigarh submits that an FIR bearing No. 83, dated 08.08.2025 was registered at Police Station East Sector 26, Chandigarh under Sections 196, 299 and 61(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, on the allegations that 8.9 kg meat



was recovered from the residential premises of the petitioner. He submits that the petitioner’s wife and son have been named as an accused. It is his stand that the petitioner has suppressed these facts from this Court. Counsel for the U.T, Chandigarh has further pointed out that at an earlier stage, petitioner had approached this Court by filing CRWP No. 8991 of 2025, which was withdrawn on 21.08.2025 with liberty to avail alternate remedy as available in accordance with law including approaching the concerned Judicial Magistrate for redressal of his grievances. Counsel submits that particulars of the said case have also been withheld by the petitioner.

4. As the petitioner has approached this Court with tainted hands and has concealed material facts, this Court is not inclined to exercise the discretionary extraordinary writ jurisdiction vested in it under Article 226 of Constitution of India. As the petitioner has approached this Court with tainted hands and has abused the process of the Court, writ petition is dismissed with costs of Rs.25,000/- which shall be deposited with Punjab and Haryana High Court Employees’ Welfare Association, Chandigarh.
