MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution for issuance of directions to respondent No.2 to protect the life and liberty of petitioner at the hands of respondent Nos.3 to 5 .

2. While issuing notice of motion on 22.10.2024, a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court had passed the following order :-

“Petitioner has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to respondent No.2 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner from the hands of respondents No.3 to 5 and not to interfere in the peaceful life of the petitioner at behest of respondents No.4 and 5.

Notice of motion for 29.11.2024.

On asking of this Court, Mr. Kewal Singh, Addl.A.G. Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of State.



In the meantime, status report be also filed.

In the meantime, life of petitioner is protected, considering threat perception.”

3. In compliance of the order dated 22.10.2024 (*ibid*) status report has already been filed by the State of Punjab, and the same is taken on record.

4. Para 7 of the status report reads as under :-

“7. That it is further submitted that from the inquiry conducted by the deponent and the statement got recorded by the petitioner, it has been revealed that the petitioner – Harpreet Kaur has left her parental home with her own free will and she has not been detained illegally by anyone. The petitioner is safely residing with her aunt and she does not require police protection, as such, the present petition deserves to be dismissed.”

5. In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner, on instructions, does not press the petition, at this stage.

6. Disposed off accordingly.

7. However, it is made clear that in case an occasion so arises, the petitioner would be at liberty to take recourse to the remedy available under law.

Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
