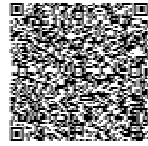

1. Prayer in the present petition, filed under Section 483 of the BNSS 2023, is for grant of interim regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.8 dated 18.02.2025, registered under Sections 21/25/29 of the NDPS Act, 1985, at Police Station State Special Operation Cell Amritsar, District Intelligence Wing (Amritsar), Punjab, for a period of three months on account of ill health of his wife.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that wife of the petitioner is pregnant and her expected date of delivery is 15.10.2025 and at present she is experiencing certain medical complications arising out of her pregnancy. It is submitted that there is no one to look after the wife of the petitioner and, thus, prayed for grant of interim regular bail to him to be able to be by the side of his wife.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On asking of the Court, Mr. J.S. Arora, DAG, Punjab, has accepted notice on behalf of the respondent-State and vehemently opposed the interim bail

application while submitting that the petitioner was apprehended in conscious possession of **10 Kgs. of heroin** which is a commercial quantity and, thereafter, on the basis of his disclosure statement, he further got recovered **2 Kgs. of heroin** and his co-accused Lovepreet Singh also got recovered **3 Kgs. of heroin**.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the available records with their able assistance.

6. The only argument raised by the learned counsel for the petitioner is that wife of the petitioner is experiencing some complications during her pregnancy and there is no one to look after her and, therefore, presence of the petitioner is very necessary to take care of his ailing wife, however, he was unable to point out any such complication from the available medical record. Moreover, a huge commercial quantity of approximately **15 Kgs. of heroin** has been recovered from the petitioner, which depicts the gravity and seriousness of the offence and its impact upon the society. Thus, this Court is not inclined to grant him interim regular bail at this stage and hence, the present petition is hereby dismissed.
