The present application has been filed under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for placing on record Annexures P-6 to P-9 on behalf of the petitioners in compliance of order dated 25.10.2024.

In view of the averments made in the application, the same is allowed and Annexures P-6 to P-9 are taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

CRM-M-53635-2024

The present petition has been filed under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.0363 dated 26.08.2024 under Sections 190(1)/115/190/191(3) of BNS (Sections 351(3)/117(4)/110 of BNS, 2023 and Section 109(1) of BNS deleted later on) registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Karnal.



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On 25.10.2024, the following order was passed:-

'Through the instant petition filed under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS), prayer is made for grant of 'anticipatory bail' to the petitioners in case FIR no.363, dated 26.08.2024 (Annexure P-1), under Sections 190(1), 115, 190, 191(3) of the BNS, 2023, (Sections 351(3), 117(4) and 110 of BNS, 2023, added and Section 109(1) BNS, 2023 deleted, later on), registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Karnal.

Learned senior counsel, in his asking for the relief (supra), mainly places reliance upon the compromise deed dated 14.09.2024, (Annexure P-3), as effected between the petitioners and the complainant/respondent no.2. He further submits that all the petitioners are medical students, in Kalpana Chawla Medical College, Karnal, Haryana, and some of them are in the final year of their medical course.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Rajesh Gaur, Addl.A.G., Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondent no.1-State, and waives service.

Mr.Anshul Gupta, Advocate, has caused appearance on behalf of respondent No.2, through a validly executed power of attorney in his favour. The same is taken on record.

Although the allegations, voiced against the present petitioners are that, they caused grievous injuries to the complainant/respondent no.2, however, considering the fact that the instant criminal proceedings would seriously jeopardise the future of the petitioners, who are stated to be medical students, besides taking into account the compromise arrived at between the petitioners and the complainant/respondent no.2 (Annexure P-3), this court deems it fit and appropriate to extend the relief of interim anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Therefore, the present petitioners are directed to join the investigation and on their doing so, if they are sought to be arrested, they be released on interim bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioners shall continue to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so, and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) BNSS, 2023.

The aforesaid relief, is being extended to the present petitioners, subject to imposition of following conditions, so that in future they mend their ways:-

- 1. Each of the petitioner shall plant 10 saplings of indigenous plants within their college campus;*
- 2. All the petitioners shall, on one day, collectively do the cleaning of the entire hostel, in which they are staying.*

Learned senior counsel for the petitioners is directed to place on record the photographs of such activities, before the next date of hearing, as a proof of compliance.

Moreover, all the petitioners shall remain personally present in the Court on the next date of hearing.

Adjourned to 20.01.2025.'



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Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Gaurav, at the very outset informs the Court that the petitioners have joined the investigation and their custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the statement of learned State counsel, order dated 25.10.2024 is hereby made absolute. The petitioners shall abide by the terms and conditions envisaged under Section 482 (2) of BNSS (earlier Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.).

The petition stands disposed of.
