MANISHA BATRA, J. (ORAL)

1. The present petition has been filed for quashing of FIR No 200 dated 16.08.2019 registered under Sections 341, 323, 148 and 149 of IPC (Section 201 of IPC and Section 181 of Motor Vehicle Act added later on), at Police Station Sadar Kharar, District SAS Nagar, Mohali and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 21.02.2023 (Annexure P-2).

2. This Court vide order dated 08.11.2024 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to get their statements recorded and the learned Magistrate was directed to send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise.

3. Pursuant to the aforesaid order, parties have appeared before the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, SAS Nagar, Mohali and got their



statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded, learned Magistrate has submitted report dated 05.12.2024 to the effect that the compromise has been effected between the parties voluntarily and without any coercion or undue influence. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that one additional accused, who was a juvenile in conflict with law, has been extended the benefit of probation.

4. Learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for respondent No.2 do not dispute the factum of compromise between the parties as well as the fact regarding extended the benefit of probation as stated above.

5. In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant FIR.

6. Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab** and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others** (2012) 10 SCC 303, this petition is allowed and FIR No 200 dated 16.08.2019 registered under Sections 341, 323, 148 and 149 of IPC (Section 201 of IPC and Section 181 of Motor Vehicle Act added later on), at Police Station Sadar Kharar, District SAS Nagar, Mohali and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 21.02.2023 (Annexure P-2) are quashed qua the petitioner.
