SURYA PARTAP SINGH, J. (Oral):

1. This petition, challenging the order dated 20.02.2025, passed by the learned trial Court (Annexure P-4), has been filed on the ground that on that day the bail granted to the petitioners was cancelled and their warrants of arrest issued.
2. Since the petitioners were on bail and one of the conditions of bail was that the petitioners would appear on each and every date, this Court does not find any ground to interfere in the above mentioned order.
3. At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner has stated that the petitioners would surrender before the learned trial Court and a direction be given to learned trial Court to dispose of the bail application presented by the petitioners expeditiously.
4. In view of above, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioners to surrender before the learned trial Court. They may move fresh application for bail before the same Court. If any such bail application is moved by the petitioners, the learned trial Court is directed to dispose of the same within a period of three days.



5. It is however, made clear that there shall not be any bar for the learned trial Court to exercise its discretion and take the petitioners into custody, or proceed against them under Section 491 BNSS (erstwhile Section 446 Cr.P.C.).
