1. The instant petition has been filed under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 (earlier Section 439 Cr.P.C.), for grant of regular bail to the petitioner, during the pendency of trial, who has been booked in a criminal case arising out of First Information Report, as detailed hereunder:-

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. Petitioner is in custody since 28.08.2025. Learned counsel further contends that co-accused of



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the petitioner namely, Kamaljit Kaur (Mand) and Gagangian Deep Singh (Mand) have already been granted the concession of interim bail by this Court, vide orders dated 22.05.2025 and 07.08.2025 (Annexures P-3 and P-4). He also submits that all the offences are triable by the Court of Magistrate and conclusion of trial would likely to take considerable time. Thus, prays for grant of regular bail.

3. Learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the prayer of grant of bail to the petitioner, keeping in view the nature of allegations and the gravity of offence involved herein. He further submits that if the petitioner is granted concession of bail, there is every likelihood of her being absconding from the trial and can indulge in similar kind of activities.

4. This Court has heard the learned counsel for the parties concerned, and has gone through the instant petition.

5. Considering the fact that all the offences are triable by the Court of Magistrate, co-accused of the petitioner namely, Kamaljit Kaur (Mand) and Gagangian Deep Singh (Mand) have already been granted the concession of interim bail by this Court, vide orders dated 22.05.2025 and 07.08.2025 (Annexures P-3 and P-4) and the factors noticed hereinabove, this Court deems it appropriate to grant the concession of bail to the petitioner.

Consequently, prayer made in the present petition is **allowed**. Petitioner is ordered to be released on bail, subject to her furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/



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Chief Judicial Magistrate/ Illaqa Magistrate/ Duty Magistrate concerned,
if not required in any other case.

6. Needless to observe that the petitioner shall not extend any threat and shall not influence any prosecution witness in any manner directly or indirectly.

7. The observation made hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the facts of the case and the Trial Court is expected to decide the case on the basis of complete evidence available on record.

8. Petition stands disposed of.
