1. The petitioner has filed the present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to issue a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing respondents to grant pending retiral benefits to the petitioner with 18% penal interest, since the retirement of the petitioner w.e.f 31.08.2023.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has already submitted a representation dated 14.04.2025 (Annexure P-6) to the official respondents and he shall be satisfied in case, appropriate directions are issued to the respondent No.2 to decide the representation dated 14.04.2025 (Annexure P-6).

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. Charanpreet Singh, AAG, Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and has no serious objection to the limited prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner, at this stage.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully.

6. At this stage, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.2 to decide the representation dated 14.04.2025 (Annexure P-6) submitted by the petitioner, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order by passing a speaking and well reasoned order. In case, petitioner is found entitled to any consequential benefits, the same shall also be released to him, without any further delay, along with reasonable rate of interest.
